Impact of Pupil Premium Grant 2019-2020

CONTEXT

The Department for Education (DfE) gives additional funding to schools for children who have received Free School Meals (FSM) during the last 6 years. The funding is called Pupil Premium Grant (PPG). This report shows how the funding received by our school for academic year 2019-2020 was used, and the impact of expenditure. Further, analysis that is more detailed can be found in our Pupil Premium Strategy Statement.

FUNDING

Pupil Premium Funding received for year 2019-2020 was £182,160

PROVISION

Additional provision included:

- High quality leadership for disadvantaged pupils
- Improved teacher training and professional development so that engagement for learning is improved for pupils, including disadvantaged pupils
- Participation in the Achievement for All Project, with support aimed directly at disadvantaged pupils and their families, supported by an external leadership coach
- A communication assistant to support communication and language across the Early Years, where baselines are low
- Targeted interventions to support the needs of disadvantaged pupils at risk of falling behind
- Strengthen in-house attendance support for disadvantaged pupils
- Targeted support for disadvantaged children with social, emotional and mental health needs
- Supporting disadvantaged children's basic needs when arriving to school i.e. through providing breakfast
- Supporting a family worker and parental engagement officer to support disadvantaged families engagement in school life
- Wider opportunities for disadvantaged pupils through school clubs and music lessons
- Educational Assistance Dog to support disadvantaged pupils, particularly those with additional needs

IMPACT

We would usually measure pupil's attainment and progress at the following points:

- End of Early Years (at the end of Reception)
- Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year One
- End of Key Stage One (at the end of Year 2)
- Multiplications Check (end of Year 4)
- End of Key Stage Two (end of Year 6)

Due to COVID 19, these statutory tests did not occur in the academic year 2019-2020.
