WEEK ENDING: 29.03.19

In Maths, we have been learning to:

This week we have been revising past SATS papers (2018). We have been impressed with the attitude and focus the children have shown during this process. We can see that the children now have more confidence in their own ability. You can do it!

In Science, we have been revising:

Electricity – looking at electrical symbols, circuits and use of electrical equipment. Next week we will revise areas that children found challenging.

In English, we have been learning to:

Write descriptive writing, using different clause structures as well as using precise vocabulary. The children have started to write explanatory text based on their own imaginary creatures.

This week's homework is:

Maths: Complete Arithmetic paper. There are 18 questions. It should take the children about 15 minutes.

English: 10-minute comprehension challenge. This should only take the children 10 minutes to complete. If they required extra time, then change pen colour so we can see which were completed after the time.

Encourage your child to turn on their performance voice when reading text; this is linked to our reading fluency project.

Spelling: The rule is "adding a range of suffixes"
